2026 FEATURED COACH, TOM MOHUN

In 1993 I was hired onto the Truckee football staff as an outside linebacker coach under my high school coach Ron Estabrook. In addition to my hiring, Estabrook brought on two other significant coaches. One of those was Bob Shaffer and we all know how that worked out. The second was a young fired up Irishman by the name of Tom Mohun. This guy would go on to be much of the heart and soul of Truckee Football. Tom Mohun spent most of his coaching career at the JV and Frosh levels where he laid the foundation of the program. He focused on "Love" and built relationships with his players that echo into their adult life. He would often remind his players to go home and "tell your parents you love them." He would also tell me at the end of every phone call, "tell your wife you love her." Coach Mohun lost his wife in a tragic incident back in the mid-2000's and it weighed on him daily. He never used it as an excuse to quit but to do the opposite and make sure others never took the important people in their lives for granted. To me this was the driving force behind the impact coach Mohun made on so many people. It was his heart and love for FAMILY!

In February of this year coach Mohun unfortunately received a very difficult call from a medical professional. I was with him in my office when he took this call and he put the Doctor on speaker. I will never forget the haunting information that came from coach Mohun's phone as they explained that he had several lesions on his liver. Over the course of the next couple weeks many tests were performed and devastating news followed. Coach Mohun was diagnosed with terminal cancer and they gave him 6 months to a year to live. Needless to say this was a major gut punch to me and countless others who know and work with Coach Mohun. From this point, in Tom Mohun fashion, he called me often and declared war on his sickness and stated, "you leave me a spot on your coaching staff coach, I'm gonna beat this!" His Faith and belief in Jesus drove him to take on the fight of his life. To the point in June the medical professionals changed his life expectancy to 2 years. No one could explain the changes as his blood work came back with great results. This gave

me immense hope in an otherwise dismal situation. His conviction and confidence had me believing...I better save him a spot on my staff!

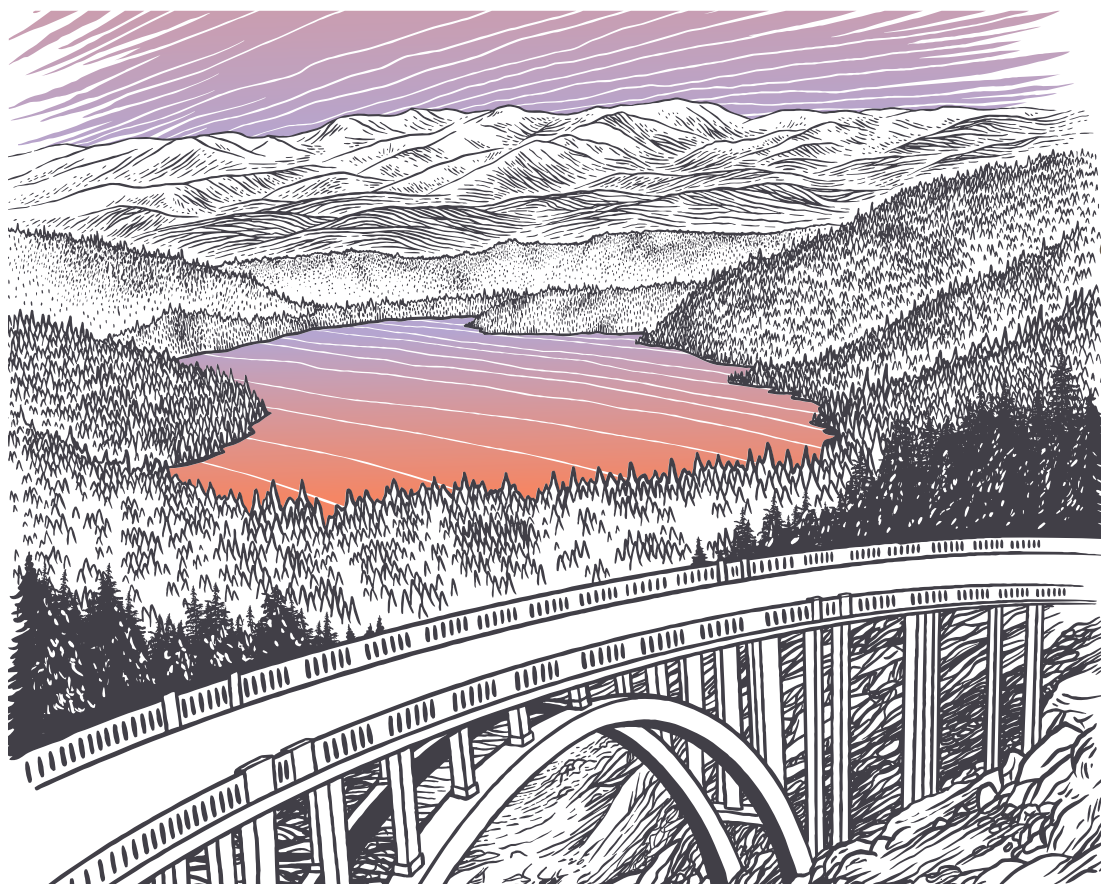
However, on July 17th more devastating news would come. Coach Mohun's cancer had now aggressively spread into other parts of his body. The result...they told coach Mohun he had 1 to 4 weeks to live.

I'm writing this on week three from receiving that news. Currently coach Mohun is still alive and kicking. I had the great opportunity to spend roughly 20 minutes with him yesterday, August 5th. It was just him and I and that is 20 minutes I will cherish for the rest of my life. We laughed a bit and also got to talk about serious circumstances

in which I started to tear up. He quickly said, “we’re not doing that coach, crying is for Fernely and everyone else in our league.” He then quoted one of our favorite movies, Unforgiven, “We all got it coming kid.” I chuckled and then proceeded to open up to Coach about many concerns and issues I was currently dealing with. Coach Mohun is my sounding board. I bounced everything off of him. Yesterday was no different as he, sick as ever, heard every word and like clockwork gave me advice. I instantly felt better and reassured. He told me several times in the 20 minutes, “you are the Phoenix and don’t forget that.” He liked to call me the Phoenix for some reason. At the end of our time he turned to me, embraced me, and said, “This could be it coach. If I don’t see you again it’s been a good ride and I will see you on the other side my friend.” That buckled me.

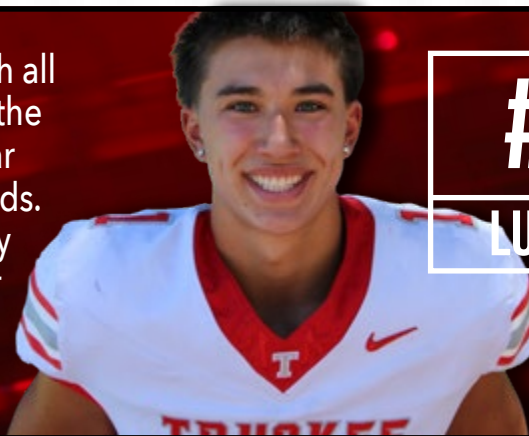

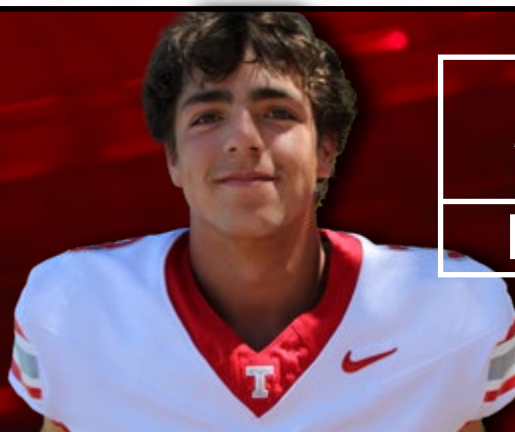

In the summer of 1990, Coach Shaffer's family embarked on an epic adventure across the United States from Ohio. They packed their bags and headed to Las Vegas, where his dad accepted a coaching position. Along the way, they made a pit stop in Truckee, California and luckily his dad turned down the coaching job in Vegas and Bobby's Uncle John offered his dad a job with Shaffer Paving. Bobby's dad coached him in Pop Warner through his senior year. His freshman year was the only year his dad didn't coach him, but he couldn't tell because his dad would yell at him from the stands during the entire game! Bobby's dad got hired in his sophomore year in 1993 as a JV coach, and Truckee won the league! Bobby even won DPOY for his team. In his junior and senior years, Truckee went 10 - 2 on two great teams. Unfortunately, they lost both state championship games, which were super close. But he still got to end his senior year with a win at the Sertoma All-Star Classic. His senior year was his dad's first year as head coach. From then on, his dad coached 18 more seasons doing ok winning

9 state championships and 3 runners-up. After high school, Coach Shaffer took his average talents to College of the Redwoods near Humboldt. They had a stacked team, won their division, and played in a bowl game. Coach then moved back home and started coaching at Truckee. After a year, he went to Sierra College and played one more year. He started at defensive end and middle backer until a shoulder injury ended his football career. After the heartbreaking and tragic loss of his Dad, he was overwhelmed by the impact his dad had not only on the athletes he coached, but all he encountered. Coach Shaffer made a promise to himself: if my son, Drake, ever played Truckee football, he'd coach again and give him what his dad gave him. So here they are, as the last Shaffer passes through this great program one last time, he looks forward to being here for it. GO WOLVERINES!

After trips to the Nevada 3A State Championship game in 2022, 2023 and 2024, the Wolverines fell short of reaching that goal in 2025, finishing with a 9-3 record. Most teams in the Nevada 3A would be very happy with a 9-3 record, but that is not in the nature of Truckee Football. When reflecting on last season, and the amount of injuries, to several key players, Coach Ivens called the result "remarkable".

The 2025 season started strong, with a come from behind victory over Konawaena, HI, 25-17. Unfortunately, it came with a cost, as several key players went down to injuries, during the Hawaii trip.

Having graduated 19 Seniors, the Wolverines will be reloading in 2026. That being said, last year's team had major contributions from the underclassmen, including several Sophomores. (There were 8 Sophomores on the Roster at the start of 2025.)

Last year, the Defense was the "question mark" at the beginning of the season. That shouldn't be the case in 2026. Coach Ivens has been very impressed with their progress, and he is expecting very good results from the D. Look for #1 Lucas Andrew, #5 Peter Iniguez, #30 Teo Newell and #66 Alan Cadena to be keys on the D. #27 Rylan Lauter will of course have some impact on Defense, but Coach Ivens looks to use him a lot more on Offense in '26, and he was one of the best RBs at Camp in Oregon, this Summer. Look for the Wolverines Defense to try and "force" opponents into making mistakes, with a bit more aggressive style.

Speaking of the Offense, the QB situation is still up for grabs at this printing, with #9 Tristan Winter and #20 Thomas Smart, both Juniors, vying for the starting role. There will be a bevy of very talented RBs to hand the ball off to, including #23 Seth Molt, #24 Ivan Esparza, #27 Lauter and #32 Bennett Jitloff. Both Molt and Esparza rushed for over 900 yards last season, with Esparza doing so in just 8 games. Lauter averaged 10.7 yards a carry, on just 21 carries, in only 3 games. Having Esparza and Lauter healthy will be a big boost for the running game.

The O-Line graduated some serious "beef" in Miles Macosko and Damian Herrera, both of whom will take their skills to the College ranks. Look for a more traditional type of O-Line for the Wolverines in '26, perhaps smaller, but quicker. The O and D lines will feature #55 Cole Schroeder, #60 David Vallin, #61 Bradley Flynn, #64 Israel Reyes and #66 Alan Cadena. At Defensive End, #30 Newell, #57 Jake Lauter and #99 Ethan Osti are all expected to see plenty of action.

With the departure of long time Coach Tom Mohun, Coach Ken Ferree will come back to handle the O-Line duties for one year. Once the QB situation is settled, he will be looking for #0, TE Owen Weakley and also getting the ball into the hands of RBs, #23 Molt and #24 Esparza. Those 3 led the team in receptions, of those players returning.

Kyle Hurst, #7, returns for the kicking duties, for his Junior year.

The Northern 3A landscape

Defending 3A State Champion Fallon, lost their QB1, and several other very good players, but they return their top 2 receivers, in Richardson and Anderson. Word is they'll be starting a Sophomore QB, so outsiders expect Fallon to try and feature the running game more in '26. As usual, they will be stacked on the lines, as they grow them big out there in farm country.

Spring Creek could very well be vying for a Northern 3A League Title, as they came close last year. They return most of the starters from a year ago.

It appears that Elko, Fernley and Truckee will be fighting it out for that 3rd spot.

All three teams lost a lot to graduation, but Truckee's underclassmen gained a lot of experience last season, so I expect the Wolverines to be a strong contender once again. (Barring injuries, as usual.) Once again, the Northern 3A should be one of the most competitive Leagues in the State. Truckee starts the season with four very tough opponents, so we'll learn a lot about the season, right away.

For a closer look at all of the Northern 3A teams, check out the "Matchups" in this Media Guide.

In the Southern 3A, (which only has 5 teams this year), according to Ray Brewer of the Las Vegas Sun, Moapa Valley and Virgin Valley appear to be the front runners, with Pahrum Valley just behind them. Both Moapa and Virgin return very good RBs.

The Playoffs: The top 6 teams in the Northern 3A will make the playoffs, and all 5 teams in the Southern 3A will make the playoffs.

WHY HAWAII? The story behind the matchup: Some might be asking how this game came about. I received a random phone call in the offseason of 2019 from a Truckee Alum named Will Silsley. Will played football and ran track at Truckee High in the mid 1990's. At the time of the phone call he was a track coach at Konawaena High School but also had connections to the football program for the Wildcats. Silsley explained that Konawaena High School is similar in size and has traditionally had a lot of success. In the past the Wildcats have made trips to the Mainland to offer their kids new experiences. The Tahoe experience was something that intrigued Konawaena. The conversation turned into a vision...a dream that the Wolverines would travel to the Big Island to play in a football game and in return Konawaena would travel to Truckee. That vision turned into planning and the Wolverines were set to play Konawaena in the 2021 season. However, Covid-19 hit the States, the Country shut down and changed everything. What was once an obtainable vision, had become a distant dream. As things moved back towards normalcy the talk of playing a game in Hawaii was rekindled in the offseason of 2023 but again it didn't happen. Where there is a will, there is a way. The discussion was struck up again during the 2024 season and this time...it happened. After six long years Truckee would finally get the opportunity to

travel to Hawaii and play in a football game and the results were amazing!

The Wolverines traveled to the Big Island last August to take on a perennial power in the Konawaena Wildcats. The Wolverines spent a whole week in Hawaii. Everyday planned and thought out to the minute. As much fun as Truckee had throughout the week, the focus was always a football game. The Wildcats are an aggressive fast team that highlights a 3 year starter at QB and a 4-star defensive end who gave Truckee fits in 2025. Last year the Wildcats started the game out with a bang forcing the Wolverines to a 3 and out and making quick work of Truckee's defense going up 7 - 0. It appeared that Konawaena would roll up Truckee early in this game but the Wolverines found their stride in the 2nd quarter and never looked back. The Wildcats would struggle to stop Truckee's run game and the Wolverines took control of the score, the clock, and the game. In the end it was the Wolverines with a 25 - 17 upset of the Wildcats. As we get years removed from this experience I believe it will be looked at as one of the bigger accomplishments Truckee has ever had in their football program's history.

What about 2026? Konawaena is making the trip to the Mainland and returns a good portion of their team. The Wildcats look to be the team to

beat again from the Big Island and likely will make another run at a State Title. They will give Truckee everything they can handle and then some. The Wolverines will need to establish their run game again if they are going to have a chance against Konawaena. The hope for Truckee is to establish their physicality and hold on until the 4th quarter when the elevation should take over. Let's hope the Wildcats are within striking distance at that point as they will be ready and highly motivated to exact revenge from last year's loss.

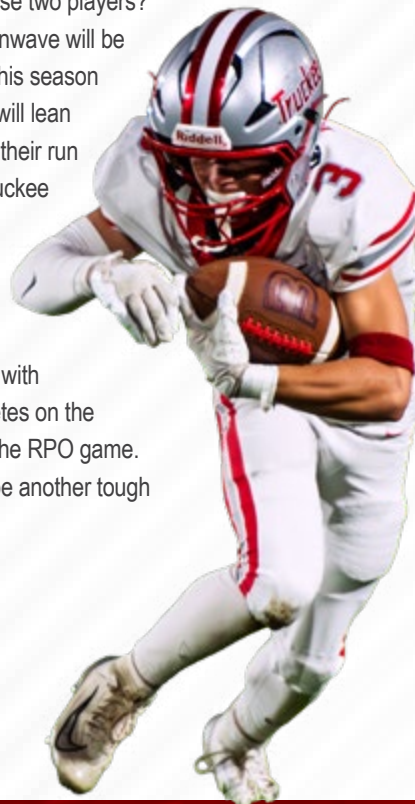

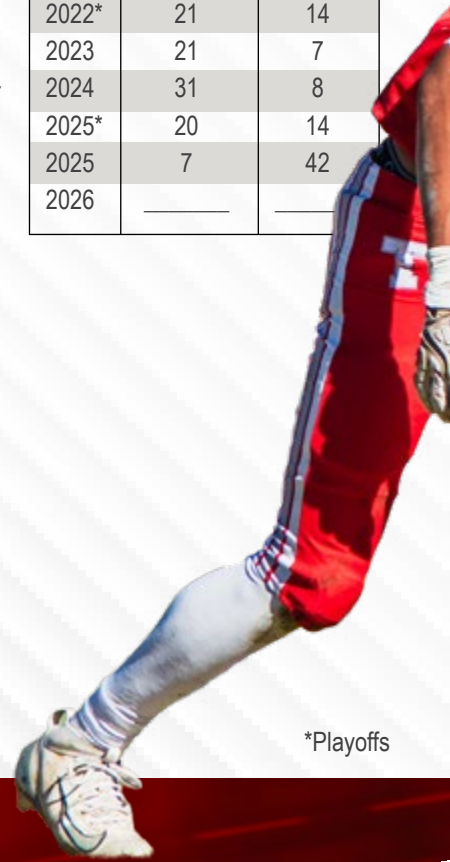

This put more on the line for both teams and South Tahoe appeared to be on their way to capturing the game's first trophy. The Vikings went into halftime leading the struggling Wolverines 19-0. Truckee came out swinging playing the most inspired football they had played in 2 seasons. Truckee rallied and went on a 22-0 run. The comeback was complete when Tanner Sawyer took a Punt return up the right sideline for a 62-yard touchdown! Truckee won 22-19, took the trophy, and hasn't given it up.

The Truckee Football Lift-A-Thon took place in late May and this year's event raised over \$78,000 - thank you to all who donated!

Every player came out and lifted their max. Family, friends, and community members showed up to support them.

Weight training at Truckee starts before players even reach high school. Incoming players learn technique in the spring of their 8th grade year using a PVC pipe instead of a bar. The pipe has no weight, so coaches can focus purely on form - squat depth, bar path, bracing - before adding load. Once technique is solid, weight gets added gradually over the following seasons.

The main lifts are squat, bench, and deadlift, along with variations. Progress is built step by step so players aren't loading weight onto poor form.

Strength training is a core part of the Truckee Football program. It helps prevent injury, builds work habits that carry into the season, and gives players a way to improve regardless of natural athletic ability. It's also where players across grade levels train together and newer players see what's expected of them.

The Lift-A-Thon is one of the top fundraisers for the Truckee Football Foundation. The money raised supports things like safety equipment, training technology, travel, coach development, team nutrition, and scholarships for graduating seniors.

TRUCKEE FOOTBALL TRAVELS TO EASTERN OREGON UNIVERSITY FOR TEAM CAMP

Truckee's coaches didn't even know if there was going to be a camp this year. Most of EOU's coaching staff had been fired. But one coach stayed on, and he became the new head coach and ran the camp, just like he'd done for the past several years.

Truckee brought 64 players to camp this year, including the JV team for the first time. This is the biggest group yet! It took some extra help from JV parents to get them there, but it was worth it. The growth of the JV team over the four days was huge, coaches said they really came together and found out who they were.

The Oregon camp is always a big part of finding Truckee's team identity, and this year was no different. There were more questions to answer at this camp than at any camp Truckee has gone to.

The team started out slow. On the first night, they were flat and didn't compete well at all. Day two also started slow, with a lack of execution. But halfway through day two's first session, the team found its stride and didn't look back.

Truckee went 4-2 in the Mountie Bowl, losing both games to the same team, who went on to the championship round. The varsity team took 3rd place after a dramatic win over the Fallon Greenwave, a game with a highlight coaches are still talking about: running back Rylan Lauter took a draw play 10 yards for the winning touchdown, making roadkill out of a Fallon defensive back right at the goal line. It was one to be remembered.

ABOUT EASTERN OREGON UNIVERSITY

Eastern Oregon University is a small public university in La Grande, Oregon, in the northeast part of the state. It was founded in 1929 as a teachers' college and is now designated as Oregon's Rural University, with roughly 2,000 to 2,800 students. The campus is a few blocks from downtown La Grande, overlooking the Grande Ronde Valley with the Blue Mountains nearby. EOU's teams, the Mountaineers, compete in the NAIA's Cascade Collegiate Conference, with football in the Frontier Conference.

Truckee to La Grande is roughly 500 miles, about 8 to 9 hours depending on the route, mostly through Nevada, Idaho, and eastern Oregon. It's always a long drive and a long four days, but Truckee's coaches say they get so much out of this camp on and off the field.

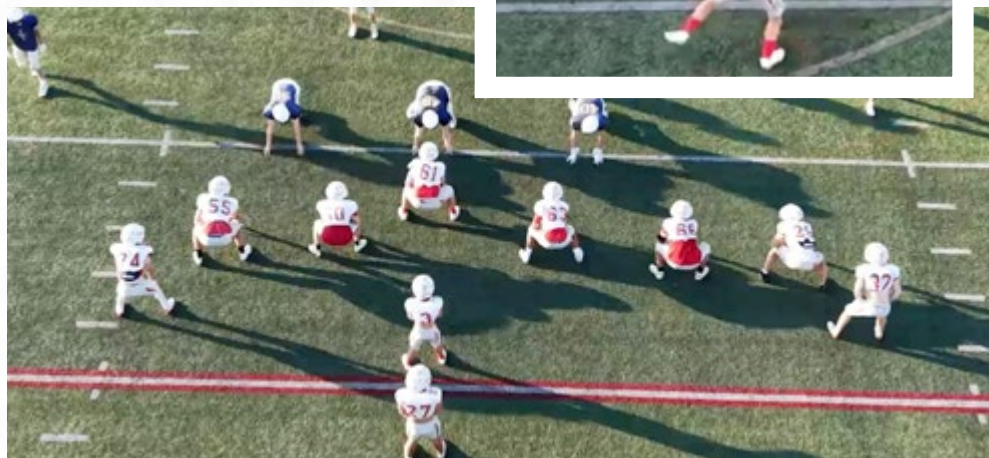

TRUCKEE POP WARNER FOOTBALL & CHEER By Marty De La Rosa

Every August, a group of kids shows up at the Riverview fields... some new, some seasoned, all wearing cleats that are a little too big and helmets that haven't quite settled in yet. Some can barely remember the snap count. A few are

still figuring out which way to run. And every single year, by the time the season ends, they're not the same kids who showed up on day one. They've become Wolverines.



Truckee football is special, and it has been for a very long time. It's ingrained in the community and in the hearts of the people in our town. This is where a lot of Truckee kids learn what it means to be part of something bigger than themselves, not because we tell them to, but because they live it, one practice at a time, in





the dirt, in the summer heat, and the occasional three foot snowstorm. They learn that showing up matters. That their teammates are counting on them. That effort is something you control, even when the outcome isn't. They learn things about themselves and their teammates that create bonds for life. Truckee football has always been and will always be about family and community.

Not to be overshadowed by football, our cheer program has become a powerhouse. In their first year, they took home 3rd place in Reno and 4th at Regionals in the PacWest with just 15 athletes. This year we have 30, and all of them attended Jamz Cheer Camp this summer. Be on the lookout for our cheer team.

Pop Warner is where it all starts for many players, and it has a profound, positive effect on young athletes. Over the past six years, Truckee Pop Warner has grown from 2 teams to 4 teams and 2 cheer teams. This season, we have 115 players total. We provide more than 15 scholarships to make sure no athlete is left out everyone gets the opportunity to play. We've invested over \$100k in new equipment over the past five years, and we'll keep outfitting our teams with the best gear available.

Our goal isn't just building better athletes, though we're doing that too. We're building kids who know how to work hard for something, how to be a good teammate, and how to get back up when they get knocked down.



Those are the things that carry them into high school, into their next team, into the next chapter of life, long after they've traded in their Wolverines uniforms.

None of this happens without the community: donations, parents who volunteer, coaches who give up their evenings, and a town that keeps showing up for these kids year after year. Truckee is a small town, but what we're building here is not small. Every rep, every practice, every Saturday morning is an investment in who these boys and girls are going to become.

WHO WE ARE

The Truckee Football Foundation partners with local businesses, families, and community members to support the Truckee High School football program and the tradition of Truckee Pride. Since 2009, the Foundation has invested over \$1 million in the program and, in recent years, has contributed approximately \$100,000 annually to support safety equipment, training technology, athlete camps and clinics, coach development, team bonding and nutrition, scholarships for graduating seniors, and other program needs.

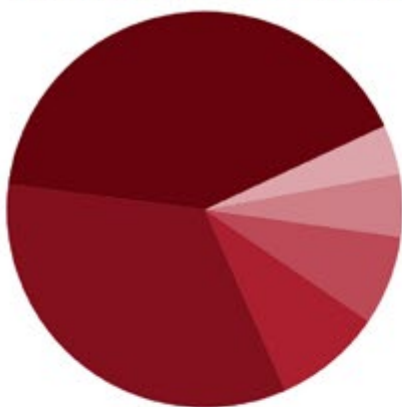

More than 95% of foundation spending directly supports players, coaches, and program excellence, with less than 5% dedicated to administrative costs.

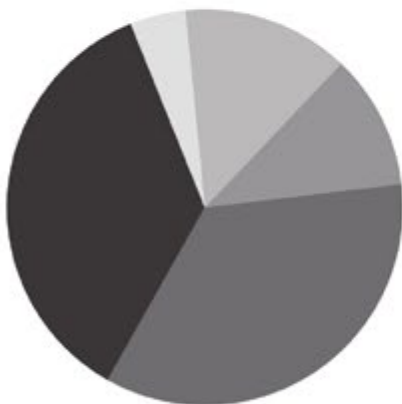


2025 GROSS REVENUE SOURCES

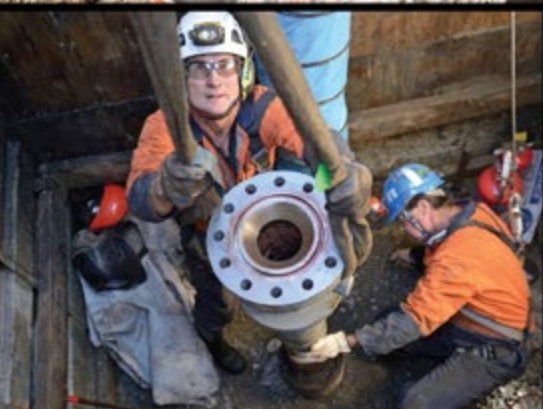
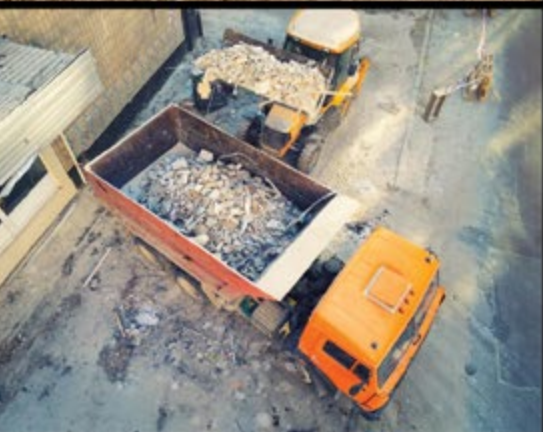

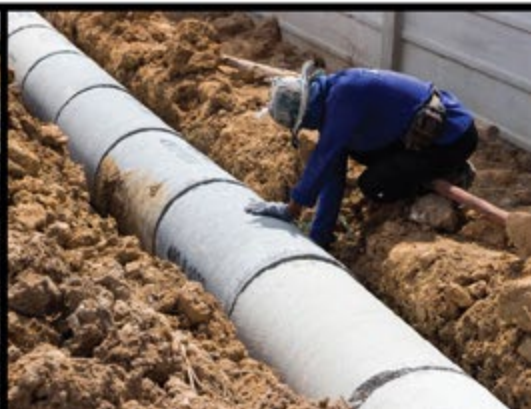
